Annual Report FY 2017

In FY 2017, Curran Seeley connected with over 1900 community members through our services, education programming, presentations and events.

- **Curran Seeley provided 102 free, confidential consultations to community members in FY2017, up from 62 in FY16 – a 65% increase**
- **We saw over 150 clients in our education and early intervention classes**
- **Curran Seeley provided the “Too Good for Drugs” curriculum to over 1000 Teton County students** in grades 4 – high school, including Colter Elementary, Jackson Hole Middle School, Jackson Hole High School, Summit High School and the Community School of Jackson Hole
- **The Alumni Council, formed in April 2016, held events and sober activities throughout the year for clients, Curran Seeley Alumni and the recovery community**
- **Community services and presentations included:**
 - Free public presentations for Alcohol Awareness Month
 - Special presentations to Rotary, Soroptomists, Stephen Ministers, and Teton County School District parent groups
 - Provided substance abuse training to all Jackson Hole Mountain Resort managers on EAP (Employee Assistance Program) programming and local resources
 - Provided two Master’s Level Internships for students, improving the future of quality local clinical staff
 - Provided scholarships for two local students who are pursuing careers in Human Services through a partnership with Jackson Hole Community Counseling Center
 - Mentored a student and participated in the Community School Senior Thesis Presentation Day Grading Panel
 - Partnered with the Community Safety Network to explore Domestic Violence Coordinated Community Response Team options

OUR TREATMENT PROGRAMS IN FY 2017

- **We saw 398 unique clients for assessments and substance use treatment services:**
 - Clients in state-contracted programs received 14,828 hours of service
 - 25% of clients were female/75% of clients were male
 - Curran Seeley saw 29 Adolescent clients for evaluations in 2017
 - Of the 398 clients seen:
 - 136 clients (34%) were recommended for no services or education
 - 155 clients (39%) were recommended for a Level I Outpatient Program
 - 78 clients (20%) were recommended for Level II.1 Intensive Outpatient Programs
 - 29 (7%) were recommended for residential services
 - 76% of our treatment clients were court ordered/24% were referred from other sources, including employers, other treatment centers, DFS, family and friends, health care professionals, schools and the clients themselves
 - 58% of clients were in treatment for a primary issue with alcohol, 25% had a primary issue with drugs
 - Same day appointments for clients in need of immediate assistance
- **Curran Seeley scored a 91.7% overall satisfaction rate on the annual State of Wyoming anonymous client satisfaction questionnaire**
- **In addition to group and individual therapy services, Curran Seeley treatment clients also received:**
 - Free flu shots and health fair blood draws offered to active clients
 - A holistic health and wellness program that helps clients improve their recovery success through physical and mental strengthening exercises
 - Primary health care support and information about nutrition
 - Mental health counseling and medication management to enrolled clients in need of these services through our Co-Occurring Program
 - Case management services
- Curran Seeley continues to be the treatment provider for the Teton County Court Supervised Treatment Program
